Project Ellie Progress Report


y cut-off bandsaw has been kept very busy recently as I produced 18 *Ellie* Boiler Kits and 13 Wheel Blank Kits. The initial idea was to make a dozen of each, but so popular has Project *Ellie* been that I ended up making a further half a dozen boiler kits. All have been bought and it is not proposed to make anymore in the immediate future.

The next stage will be to hold boiler making sessions for those that need tuition. These will probably be held at Littledown with groups of a maximum of four Members in a group.

The laser cut brass parts to make the basic frame for the single cylinder oscillating engine as described in the *Ellie* book have now been delivered. As I ordered two sets I will now be able to progress with the development of the twin cylinder engine!
